CAMERON PARISH POLICE JURY

DECEMBER 14, 2018

The Cameron Parish Police Jury met in regular session on Friday, December 14, 2018, in the Cameron Parish West Annex Board Room in the Village of Cameron, Louisiana at 3:00 o'clock P.M. The following members were present: Mr. Davy Doxey, Mr. Terry Beard, Mr. Joe Dupont, Mr. Darryl Farque, Mr. Kirk Quinn, Mr. Magnus McGee, and Mr. Lawrence Faulk. The following member was absent: Mr. Anthony Hicks.

It was moved by Mr. McGee, seconded by Mr. Doxey and carried, that the reading of the minutes shall be dispensed with and approved.

There was no Public Comment on the agenda items.

It was moved by Mr. Beard, seconded by Mr. Farque and carried, that the board hereby approves to add the following items to the agenda: (Item 19) Authority to allocate funds not to exceed \$150,000.00 to finish the Cameron Fisheries Project. (Item 20) Authority to amend Employee Classification Policy to extend steps 0-25 years. (Item 21) President authority to sign public comment letter for WOTUS (Waters of the United States)

It was moved by Mr. Quinn, seconded by Mr. McGee and carried, that the applications for the following Drilling and Pipeline permits be and the same are hereby approved with the stipulations set forth by the respective Gravity Drainage Districts:

- a. Shelf Energy LLC - Hackberry, Section 20 & 28, T12S, R 12W, (proposed Brown Odom-Pintail Alley Facility, installation of (2) 6-inch connector flowlines at existing facility to adjacent buried pipeline, (1) 6-inch connector pipeline, and SWD Well), Cameron Parish, LA. (181201)

It was moved by Mr. Quinn, seconded by Mr. McGee and carried, that the applications for the following permits be and the same are hereby approved with the stipulations set forth by the respective Gravity Drainage Districts, with the exception of Agenda Item 6(b) which is hereby tabled until further notice:

- a. CAJJ, LLC - Creole, Trosclair Rd. Section 31, T14S, R7W, (proposed development of RV Park, office, and laundromat providing approximately 105 RV Spaces, to support temporary housing for construction workers and recreational camp sites), Cameron Parish, LA. (181202)
- b. Jordan Lands, LLC - Sweetlake, Off LA Hwy 384, Section 17, T12S, R7W, (proposed excavation of borrow/pit, approximately 142 acres, to provide fill material for local industry and infrastructure), Cameron Parish, LA. (181203) **Permit tabled until further notice**

- c. Louisiana Tank, Inc. - GIWW, Gibbstown, Section 10, T13S, R7W, (proposed maintenance dredging of existing barge slip, approximately 9,635 cubic yards to be dredged and used to backfill existing containment pit on property and the remainder of material will be utilized on-site to raise ground elevation, hauling of 6-inch aggregate to cover area, and repair existing bulkhead), Cameron Parish, LA. (181204)
- d. Cameron Parish Gravity Drainage District No. 5 - Grand Chenier Area, (proposed levee restoration project; project consist of levee stabilization and restoration of 133,085 linear feet of five existing marsh management levee segments and 28 existing water control structures, approx., 780,520 cy of water bottom material to be dredged to restore the levees and approx. 772 cy of rip rap to be placed around the inlets and outlets of the water control structures for erosion protection), Cameron Parish, LA. (181205)
- e. Harvest Midstream - Hackberry, End of Shell Western Rd., (proposed Hackberry Crude Oil Pipeline Project; abandon in place 4-inch Tank battery Crude Oil Pipeline (approx. 5,042 linear feet), 6-inch Black Bayou Crude Oil Pipeline (approx. 45,562 linear feet), and 6-inch Hackberry Crude Oil mainline (approx. 15,165 linear feet), and all above-ground structures to be removed), Cameron Parish, LA. (181206)
- f. Cocahoe Fishing Club, L.L.C. - Big Lake, 103 West Harbor Dr., Section 28, T12S, R9W, (proposed removal of levee or relocate levee being its function or purpose is no longer necessary, applicant would prefer complete leveling of the 400 ft. levee), Cameron Parish, LA. (181207)
- g. Columbia Gulf Transmission - Grand Chenier, Section NA, T15S-T16S, R3W, (proposed East Cameron 23 Field Line abandonment, approximately 6.8 miles of 16-inch pipeline, 215 feet of 12-inch pipeline and removal of associated facilities), Cameron Parish, LA. (181208)

It was moved by Mr. Quinn, seconded by Mr. Farque and carried, to conduct a public hearing to hear comments, written or oral, regarding the intention of the board to abandon the following parish road:

Parish Road 452, Melba's Lane; located in Section 15, T12S, R8W, Grand Lake, LA.

**WHEREAS**, the auditorium of the Cameron Elementary School was part of the school campus and used for both school and community events was destroyed by Hurricane Rita and;

**WHEREAS**, the Cameron Elementary site was used as the site for the new Cameron Parish School Board Office and Educational Conference Center and;

**WHEREAS**, the Educational Conference Center has been used on a limited basis for school related events, community events, and business meetings but is continued to be maintained by the School System and;

**WHEREAS**, the Cameron Parish School Board has determined that the Educational Conference Center is no longer needed for the purpose of school functions, and;

**WHEREAS**, the Cameron Parish Main Library is in need of a facility meeting elevation and building codes;

**WHEREAS**, the controlling board of the Cameron Parish Library has adopted a resolution approving the purchase of the Educational Conference Center building and property;

**THEREFORE**, the Cameron Parish Police Jury, on behalf of the Cameron Parish Main Library, does hereby agree to purchase the Educational Conference Center building and property from the Cameron Parish School Board for the amount of \$2,600,000.00 and does hereby grant authority to the President of the Cameron Parish Police Jury to execute any and all necessary documents to complete the sale and transfer. The legal description of said property is attached hereto and made a part hereof.
