## MAY 17, 2019

The Cameron Parish Police Jury met in regular session on Friday, May 17, 2019, in the Cameron Parish West Annex Board Room in the Village of Cameron, Louisiana at 2:00 o'clock P.M. There were no members absent.

There was no Public Comment on the agenda items.

It was moved by Mr. Beard, seconded by Mr. Farque and carried, that the reading of the minutes shall be dispensed with and approved.

# Proposed Amendments to Chapter 19 - Roads & Drainage, Article 1. - In General (as written below)

Sec. 19-10 - Temporary Traffic Restriction on Parish Roads

In accordance with LA RS 32:41, the Cameron Parish Police Jury reserves the right to temporarily restrict public access on any parish road when it is determined by the governing authority that conditions exist that create unsafe environments and/or public safety concerns, during situations including, but not limited to, the following:

- 1. Road maintenance activity
- 2. Public works projects
- 3. Private construction projects, provided that
  - a. Local business interests are provided access to conduct business within the temporary traffic restricted area
  - b. Property owners are allowed access to their property affected by temporary traffic restricted area
- 4. Flooding or storm damage

The said parish road shall be returned to its original state of use by the party responsible for the temporary restriction after the governing authority determines conditions are safe to resume public use.

It was moved by Mr. Farque, seconded by Mr. Quinn and carried, the board does hereby authorize, empower and direct the President to sign a letter of recommendation to the Governor's Division of Administration for the Appointment to the Chenier Plain Board.
